PLANT AMERICA GRANT AWARDED TO GFFG

NGC President Mary Warshauer is pleased to announce a recipient of Plant America Community Project grant from Montana. *It's the Great Falls Flower Growers Club!* They received notification before Christmas after having supplied the necessary information on their application.



In the fall of 2021, the Great Falls Flowers Growers Club decided to clean up and replant the Tourist Park with native trees shrubs, and perennials. In April of 2022, Kerry Hovland and Cheryl Hagastad began whacking and pulling miles of Engleman Ivy and filling trash bags full of buckthorn, thistles, and every kind of weed imaginable. As one area was cleaned, Steffen Janikula, Trail Coordinator, laid down weed fabric, then hauled beautiful rocks and landscaped the area. Steffen and his crew, also built a special flower bed, for the Great Falls city flower, the Iris.

Kerry Hovland, Tourist Park Chairman, applied for a grant of \$250 worth of product from Espoma, \$980 from Plant America, and also a \$1500 grant from The Native Plant Society. GFFG was fortunate to receive all three.

Alex Smithson, Trail Artist, is going to design a metal Iris, to showcase the Iris bed. Our club along with Steffen, Trail Coordinator, and The Native Plant Society will begin selecting and planting this summer.

It has an abundance of fragrant white flowers reminiscent of Orange Blossoms. It was described by Meriwether Lewis on his expedition. Native Americans used its straight stems in making arrows.

Great Falls Flower Growers Celebrate 90 Years!

Great Falls Flower Growers was established March 10, 1933 and was federated with MFGC in 1938. Back in those early years monthly meetings were quite a social event. Ladies dressed to the "nines", wearing their "Sunday best", including hats, gloves, and jewelry. The *"ROSE"* which was chosen as their logo, remains the same as is their colors: rose and green. Today a new member receives a rose and a giant cookie, letting them know, they are a SMART COOKIE for joining GFFG.

Organizing a garden club in 1933, was not an easy task. These forward-thinking ladies had no money, just a strong desire to make it happen. The Anaconda Company Smelter, along with the local florists, and the Chamber of Commerce, were instrumental in getting GFFG started. During the 1950's, membership was at 350. Due to the size of the club, it was difficult to find a meeting place and in 1957, the club split, keeping GFFG and forming RGC (*Rainbow Garden Club*).

On March 10 the Great Falls Flower Growers members and guests celebrated this milestone anniversary with a special party at the Meadow Lark Country Club (albeit during a raging blizzard). Everyone dressed in their finest with hats and gloves. Special floral arrangements were designed by Patty Howse for the tables representing "Past, Present and Future." MFGC'S SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS REACHES MANY MORE SCHOOLS

Although our Life Member Scholarship Applications are primarily sent to our 4-year state universities we think it is important to remember that many students attend the two-year schools for various reasons (financial, location, etc.), and then transfer to a four-year school when they've decided their majors. We do know that students studying some kinds of Ag are excellent candidates for MFGC/NGC scholarships, i.e., Scholarship Recipient Tyler Noyes is an outstanding example.

In January Life Member's Chair, Patricia Schlaeger, sent out news releases to all the newspapers in Montana and up-dated scholarship applications to all the post-graduate schools in the state of Montana to announce the \$2,000 scholarship for Life Members.

The ENDOWMENT INTEREST GRANT is a competitive program designed with local clubs and Montana Federation of Garden Clubs, Inc. sponsored groups as eligible recipients. Grants will be given up to \$500. For every five dollars of grant funding, applicants must have at least one dollar of matching funds for the project. PENNY PINE\$

Your Garden Club can participate in a meaningful and practical conservation project by contributing \$68.00 to a Penny Pines plantation as part of the costs of replanting replacement trees indigenous to a particular damaged area. Whether by fire or by other natural catastrophe, pine trees and other trees are replaced. You may designate a specific forest you wish to have benefit from this contribution.

Under a conservation agreement, the forest service will do the planting, using your donation together with federal funds, and will provide to the plantation the same protection from fires, insects, and disease given other forested areas. The plantations are a part of the regular national forest reforestation program planted on burnedover and brush-covered areas which are potentially productive timberlands. Planting sites are selected by the supervisor of each national forest. These plantations provide soil protection, watershed protection, soil stabilization, future harvestable timber, as well as beauty and shade for recreation.

States, regions, districts, clubs, and/or individuals may participate in this program by donating in multiples of \$68. A \$68 donation may be made in honor or in memory of ONE individual, organization, or theme.

Remember to always pass the "money change jar" around the room during your club's meetings!
